- 4. Title: Insurance networks; dental services.
- **5. Summary:** Establishes limits on the ability of a health carrier or third-party administrator to sell or otherwise grant access, as provided in a dentist's or oral surgeon's provider contract, to a third-party carrier. The measure provides that such access may be granted only if it is expressly permitted by the provider contract and notice is given to the affected participating providers. The contracting entity or carrier is required to inform participating providers, upon request, which network plans have been granted access to the contract by the contracting entity. The contracting entity or third-party administrator that grants access to the provider contract shall ensure that remittance advice furnished to the participating provider that delivers the dental services under the contract identifies the contract source relied upon to discount a payment or reimbursement to the provider. Such remittance advice shall also include the name of the provider with whom the contract was originally negotiated and a calculation of how the payment or reimbursement was determined.
