- **3.** Committee: Education and Health
- **4. Title:** School boards; local law-enforcement agencies, memorandums of understanding.
- 5. Summary: Requires the school board in each school division in which the local lawenforcement agency employs school resource officers to enter into a memorandum of understanding with such local law-enforcement agency that sets forth the powers and duties of the school resource officers. The bill requires each such school board and local lawenforcement agency to review and amend or affirm the memorandum at least once every five years or at any time upon the request of either party. The bill also requires the Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety to develop a model memorandum of understanding that shall be reviewed by local school boards and local law-enforcement agencies to satisfy the new requirements put forth in the bill.

- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See item 8.
- **8.** Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that this legislation will not have a state fiscal impact. Any impact to localities is indeterminate.

The Virginia Center for School and Campus Safety (VCSCS), which is a component of the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS), currently has a model memorandum of understanding (MOU), as well as a "School – Law Enforcement Partnership Guide." Updates to the existing model MOU can be absorbed within current resources.
