**4. Title:** Pharmaceutical processors; employment; misdemeanors.

**5. Summary:** The bill provides that no person who has been convicted of a felony under the laws of the Commonwealth or another jurisdiction within the last five years, or of any offense in violation of Article 1 (§ 18.2-247 et seq.) or Article 1.1 (§ 18.2-265.1 et seq.) of Chapter 7 of Title 18.2 or a substantially similar offense under the laws of another jurisdiction shall be employed by or act as an agent of a pharmaceutical processor. And that every pharmaceutical processor shall adopt policies for pre-employment drug screening and regular, ongoing, random drug screening of employees.
