5.	Summary: The substitute bill requires the Department of Corrections to adopt a policy regarding visitors who may be menstruating at the time of their visit to state correctional facilities. The policy shall include (i) a process to notify such a visitor of the Department's policy in advance of the visit; (ii) an option for the visitor to remove any tampon or menstrual cup and replace it with a state-issued product in order to complete a contact visit and (iii) an option for a visitor who refuses to remove any tampon or menstrual cup to complete a non-contact visit. The Department is required to make the policy available to the public as soon as practicable and must provide a copy of the policy to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Militia, Police and Public Safety and the Senate Committee on Rehabilitation and Social Services by November 1, 2019.
