3. Committee: Passed both houses

4. Title: Public institutions of higher education; in-state tuition; foreign service officers.

5. Summary: Requires public institutions of higher education to waive the one-year domiciliary intent requirement for foreign service officers residing in the Commonwealth and their spouses and dependents. The bill requires any dependent of any foreign service officer who resided in the Commonwealth immediately prior to receiving his foreign service assignment to be deemed to be domiciled in the Commonwealth and declares any such dependent eligible to receive in-state tuition.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: Public institutions of higher education would collect less tuition revenue from students who currently pay out-of-state tuition and are made eligible for in-state tuition by this legislation, however the amount of lost revenue is indeterminate.
