4. Title: Barbers and cosmetologists; exemptions; threading.

5. Summary: Exempts persons whose activities are confined solely to removing unwanted hair by the use of string or thread from being required to obtain an occupational license.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that this bill will not result in a fiscal impact to the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR). DPOR does not have a specific regulated profession that only does threading. Currently, some licensed cosmetologists and estheticians may perform threading as part of their services and will continue to keep their licenses. This bill clarifies that individuals only wanting to do threading will not need a license.
