**3. Committee:** Militia, Police and Public Safety

**4. Title:** Department of Criminal Justice Services; definition of law-enforcement officer; Virginia Lottery.

**5. Summary:** Removes from the definition of law-enforcement officer, as it applies to an investigator who is a sworn member of the security division of the Virginia Lottery, the requirement that such investigator be a full-time member of the division.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary – see Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation will have a minimal fiscal impact for the Virginia Lottery (Lottery) and the Line of Duty Death and Health Benefits Trust Fund. The Lottery currently has one part-time investigator who would be covered under the Line of Duty Act (LODA) pursuant to the passage of the proposed legislation. Any additional costs incurred to support the Lottery's part-time investigators would be included in subsequent LODA invoices. The current LODA premium is \$705.77 per employee.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Virginia Lottery, Department of Human Resource Management, and Virginia Retirement System.
