- 4. Title: Special license plate; Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal
- **5. Summary:** This bill creates a special license plate for persons awarded the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal or for unremarried surviving spouses of such persons.
- 6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.
- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item #8.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) normally uses the money generated by the 450 prepaid applications, required in accordance with *Va. Code* § 46.2-725, to offset the initial costs of production and materials required to issue a new special plate series. Should this legislation pass, the agency will be required to absorb the material and production cost to develop a new plate series that is normally provided by the 450 prepaid applications, while being required to make available a special plate series that may produce a small number of active plates holders. However, DMV anticipates these costs will be recouped over time through the \$10, one-time fee charged at the plate's issuance. The substitute version of the bill subjects these plates to the appropriate registration fees set out in Chapter 6 of Title 46.2 of the *Code*.

The staff hours required to implement this legislation can be accomplished during the normal work schedules for DMV employees, given current workloads. DMV would be able to absorb this cost within its existing resources assuming other legislative proposals with fiscal impacts to DMV are not passed. DMV's current fiscal outlook precludes funding the cumulative burden of implementing the programming and staffing requirements of multiple pieces of legislation without improved revenue streams.
