**4. Title:** DNA analysis; conviction of certain crimes or similar ordinance of a locality.

Summary:** The proposed legislation adds persons convicted of local ordinances that are similar to certain crimes listed under current law to the list of persons from whom a blood, saliva, or tissue sample shall be taken for DNA analysis to determine identification characteristics specific to the person.
