4. Title: Teacher licensure; provisional license; American Board for Certification of Teacher Excellence.

5. Summary: Requires the Board of Education (Board) to provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any individual who has successfully completed the American Board for Certification of Teacher Excellence alternative teacher certification program and who meets the basic conditions for licensure established by the Board pursuant to subsection A of 8VAC20-23-40.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Education's (DOE) Office of Teacher Licensure does not have existing staff that can develop the guidelines prescribed by this bill. DOE estimates a state cost of \$25,000 in FY 2020 to support a six-month wage position to draft the guidelines for a provisional license for teachers that have completed the American Board for Certification of Teacher Excellence alternative certification program.
