4. Title: Maximum charges for vehicle safety inspections

5. Summary: Increases from \$16 to \$20 the maximum amount a motor vehicle safety inspection station can charge for an inspection of any vehicle other than: a motorcycle; an autocycle; a tractor truck; a truck that has a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,000 pounds or more; or a motor vehicle that is used to transport passengers and has a seating capacity of more than 15 passengers, including the driver. The enrolled bill would increase the amount the Department of State Police (VSP) collects for each such vehicle inspection, from \$0.50 to \$0.70 per inspection.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of State Police (VSP) administers aspects of the vehicle safety inspection program, and collects a portion of each vehicle inspection fee to administer the program. The enrolled version of this legislation would increase from \$0.50 to \$0.70 the amount of fees VSP collects for inspections of certain types of vehicles. According to VSP, there were 8 million vehicles inspected in 2018. Assuming the same number of vehicles are inspected each year, VSP estimates it would collect an additional revenue of \$1.6 million from the additional fee (nongeneral funds) in 2019 and beyond.
