3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Minimum wage; exemptions.

5. Summary: Removes the exemptions for newsboys, shoe-shine boys, ushers, doormen, concession attendants, theater cashiers, and persons who normally work and are paid on the basis of the amount of work done from coverage under the Virginia Minimum Wage Act (the Act). The measure limits the Act's exemption for babysitters to babysitters not employed more than 10 hours per week.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Labor and Industry's (DOLI) Labor Law division would have to begin enforcing the new minimum wage provisions for newsboys, shoe-shine boys, ushers, doormen, concession attendants, theatre cashiers, and babysitters employed less than 10 hours per week. It is anticipated that DOLI can absorb any fiscal impact that may result from claims from this limited group of employees.
