3. Committee: House Appropriations Committee

4. Title: Department of Criminal Justice Services; school resource officers; school administrators; training.

5. Summary: The substitute bill requires the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to establish compulsory minimum training standards for certification and recertification of law-enforcement officers serving as school resource officers. The bill also specifies that such training shall be specific to the role and responsibility of a law-enforcement officer working with students in a school environment. The bill requires that within a period of time specified by the Board, every full-time or part-time law-enforcement officer employed as a school resource officer after July 1, 2020, to comply with the compulsory minimum training standards for school resource officers establish by DCJS.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No. Item 392 of the Governor's introduced budget bill (HB1700/SB1100) includes an appropriation to support this legislation.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary (see Item 8 below).

8. Fiscal Implications: The substitute version of this bill requires the DCJS to establish compulsory minimum training standards for certification and recertification of law-enforcement officers serving as school resource officers, as specified. All full-time and part-time law enforcement officer employed as a school resource officer after July 1, 2020 must comply with the compulsory minimum training standards. Currently, the Department of Criminal Justice Services provides training to school resource officers that are supported by state grant funding. The Governor's introduced budget (HB1700/SB1100) provides one position and \$427,630 to enable the agency to provide basic training to every school resource officer.
