8. Fiscal Implications: This bill creates an advisory committee consisting of no more than 20 nonlegislative citizen members and two ex officio members. Nonlegislative citizen members will not receive compensation for their services; however, all members must be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. The Department of Education (DOE) is required to fund the cost of committee member expenses.

DOE estimates a state cost of approximately \$14,260 each year to support the costs of the advisory committee and reimbursement of member expenses, including, but not limited to, travel, lodging, meals, meeting space, supplies, and materials. This estimate assumes that the committee will meet four times per year; however, the bill states that the committee shall meet at such times as it deems appropriate or on the call of the chairman, which could result in additional agency expenses. It is anticipated that the Department of Education and the

Department of Health can absorb any additional costs related to staff support of this committee.
