3. Committee: Privileges and Elections

4. Title: Correctional facilities, local; voting information for persons incarcerated.

5. Summary: Provides that the Board of Corrections shall make, adopt, and promulgate rules and regulations regarding the provision of information on absentee voting to all persons confined in a local correctional facility who may be eligible to vote and information on the process of applying for a restoration of civil rights and of voting rights for those persons who have been convicted of a felony.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill requires the Board of Corrections to create rules and regulations to provide information to those in local correctional facilities regarding absentee ballots and the process of applying for the restoration of civil rights and voting rights. Any potential impact is indeterminate and would depend on the rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Corrections pursuant to the bill.

This bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the Department of Elections.
