Estimate of Local Fiscal Impact

In accordance with the provisions of §30-19.03 of the Code of Virginia, the staff of the Commission on Local Government offers the following analysis of the above-referenced legislation:

Bill Summary:

Smoking in outdoor amphitheater or concert venue; civil penalty. Authorizes any locality, by ordinance, to designate reasonable no-smoking areas within an outdoor amphitheater or concert venue owned by the locality. The bill requires such ordinance to (i) require adequate signage designating such areas, (ii) provide that a violation of such ordinance is subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$25 to be paid into the treasury of the locality where the offense occurred and expended solely for public health purposes, and (iii) provide that any law-enforcement officer may issue a summons regarding a violation of the ordinance.

Executive Summary:

Localities have evaluated a negative fiscal impact ranging from \$0.00 - \$500.00. However most localities indicated that the bill would have little to no fiscal impact, and noted that the cost would be related to adjusting local ordinances, installing "no smoking" signs, and the cost to write the summons regarding the violations by the public safety officer. Some localities noted that the cost would be offset by the potential revenue from this bill. One locality noted that the penalty is low to which most public safety officers could give a warning to those violating the code. Other localities noted that there would be no cost as they do not have any amphitheater or concert venue.

Local Analysis:

Locality: City of Danville Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

Staff do not see any significant expenditure/revenue should a local ordinance be implemented.

Possible non-monetary impacts could include issues with sponsors for events that might be related to the tobacco industry.

Locality: City of Norfolk Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

The City of Norfolk expects a minor impact from the bill. The City of Norfolk has designated outdoor smoking areas at all venues owned by the city and prohibits smoking of any kind indoors at all venues. Each designated area has signage and all prohibited areas also have appropriate signage. The only impact Norfolk would see is adjusting city ordinances to change the penalty from a Class 4 Misdemeanor to the civil penalty of up to \$25 as well as designate collected funds for public health purposes.

Locality: City of Poquoson

Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

For my region, no fiscal impact due to not having outdoor amphitheater or concert venue. My opinion is the penalty is low due to the fact that most public safety officers will give a warning to the individual who is violating the code. Therefore it would cost the locality time value for the public safety officer to wrote the summons regarding a violation of the ordinance seeing how the officer has already spent time once before to give the warning.

Locality: City of Virginia Beach

Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

It is not anticipated that SB1304 would result in regular expenditures by the City of Virginia Beach (aside for the potential cost of the initial installation of signs), and may present an unknown, yet likely small annual revenue gain. Generally, events at the Veterans United Home Loans Amphitheater already have local law enforcement present, so enforcement of this civil penalty would not result in any additional law enforcement cost.

Locality: City of Winchester

Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$100.00

Locality: Fairfax County

Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

There will be a minimal expenditure impact for the cost of putting up 'no smoking' signs. There may be a minimal positive revenue impact from citations issued for smoking in non-smoking areas.

Locality: Henrico County.

Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

Henrico County does not own an outdoor amphitheater or concert venue. Therefore, this bill does not currently have a fiscal impact.

Locality: Prince George County

Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

Prince George County does not own such an outdoor venue.

Locality: Rappahannock County

Estimated Fiscal Impact: \$0.00

The proposal includes permissive language "Any locality, by ordinance, MAY designate reasonable ..." and as such the fiscal impact is negligible to those that have no interest. Localities that choose to proceed with a local ordinance can consider the cost of enforcing the regulation compared with the benefits.
