**2. Patron:** Carrico

**3. Committee:** Senate Committee for Courts of Justice

**4. Title:** Department of Criminal Justice Services; minimum standards for law-enforcement officers.

**5. Summary:** Requires the Department to establish compulsory training standards for certification and recertification of law-enforcement officers in Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training and to coordinate the delivery of such training.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary (see Item 8 below).

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation requires the Department of Criminal Justice Service (DCJS) to establish certification and recertification training standards for law-enforcement in Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training and coordinate the delivery of such training.

DCJS reports that since it remains unknown how many law-enforcement officers will seek certification and subsequent recertification under the proposed legislation, the fiscal impact is indeterminate at this time

**11. Other Comments:** The Governor's introduced budget (HB1700/SB1100) includes one position and \$280,000 for active shooter training for schools and communities.
