- **5. Summary:** Requires the Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority ("ABC") to pay a distiller who operates a government store on the distiller's licensed premises a commission of not less than 20 percent of the retail price of any goods sold. The bill also allows certain government stores, as determined by the ABC Board, to be open on Sundays for the sale of alcoholic beverages after 10:00 a.m.

8. Fiscal Implications: Currently, there are 45 distillery stores in the Commonwealth. Based on current distillery store agreements, each distillery store is paid a commission calculated at 8 percent of gross monthly sales. In FY2018, ABC paid \$467,824 in distillery store commissions.

The proposed bill would increase distillery store commissions from 8 percent to a minimum of 20 percent. According to ABC, distillery store commissions is expected to grow at a rate of 4 percent per year.

The proposed bill would also permit ABC to open government stores on Sundays after 10 a.m. Currently, ABC opens stores on Sundays beginning at 12 noon. Under the proposed bill, ABC is anticipating opening approximately 253 government stores after 10 a.m. on Sundays. Based upon projections from ABC, FY2020 total gross sales from opening the 253 stores after 10 a.m. would amount to roughly \$3.6 million, which would net approximately \$858,697 in gross profits.

As shown in the following table, the anticipated increase in profits from earlier Sunday hours is sufficient to cover the anticipated increase in expenses due to higher distiller commissions:
