7 supported the community as a member of the Virginia Beach Department of Public Utilities, died on
8 May 31, 2019; and

10 member of the United States Army and rose to the rank of captain in the 84th Engineer Battalion over
11 the course of his 10-year military career; and

WHEREAS, after his honorable military service, Richard Nettleton settled in Norfolk in 1987 and
began working for the City of Virginia Beach in the Department of Public Works in 1991; he then
transferred to the Department of Public Utilities in 1999; and

WHEREAS, as a design and construction manager for the Virginia Beach Department of Public
 Utilities, Richard Nettleton oversaw the design, installation, and maintenance of underground water and
 sewer lines; and

18 WHEREAS, during his 28-year tenure with the City of Virginia Beach, Richard Nettleton earned a19 reputation for strong leadership and a commitment to professionalism; and

WHEREAS, Richard Nettleton shared his expertise with the Hampton Roads Planning District
 Commission Regional Construction Standards committee and was a member of the National Society of
 Professional Engineers and the American Society of Civil Engineers; and

WHEREAS, Richard Nettleton will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his loving wife of
years, Sarah; his sons, Richard, Jr., and Robert; his stepchildren, Byron and Mary Elizabeth; his
mother, Teresa; and numerous other family members, friends, and colleagues at the Virginia Beach
Department of Public Utilities; now, therefore, be it
