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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

2 An Act to direct the State Corporation Commission to create a task force to evaluate and analyze the
3 potential for bulk energy storage resources to help integrate renewable energy into the electrical
4 grid.

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Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. § 1. The State Corporation Commission shall create a task force to evaluate and analyze the 9 regulatory, market, and local barriers to the deployment of distribution and transmission-connected bulk 10 energy storage resources to help integrate renewable energy into the electrical grid, reduce costs for the electricity system, allow customers to deploy storage technologies to reduce their energy costs, and 11 allow customers to participate in electricity markets for energy, capacity, and ancillary services. The 12 task force shall include representatives of municipalities, the Virginia Solar Energy Development and 13 Energy Storage Authority, and the Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy, the Office of the 14 15 Attorney General, and at least one representative each from the following sectors: regulated electric service providers, competitive electric service providers, rural utility consumer services cooperatives, 16 17 commercial or industrial energy customers or an association representing such customers, and energy 18 storage companies or an association representing such companies. The task force may consult with the 19 regional transmission organization. In its evaluation, the task force shall (i) assess the potential costs 20 and benefits, including impacts to the transmission and distribution systems, of such energy storage 21 resources and (ii) assess how electric utilities, competitive service providers, customers, and other third 22 parties are able to deploy energy storage resources in the bulk market, in the utility system, and in 23 behind-the-meter applications. The State Corporation Commission shall submit a copy of the task force's 24 evaluation and analysis to the General Assembly no later than October 1, 2021.
