7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 37 of Title 54.1 an article 9 numbered 2, consisting of sections numbered 54.1-3709.1, 54.1-3709.2, and 54.1-3709.3, as follows:

Article 2.

Music Therapy.

#### § 54.1-3709.1. Definitions.

As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:

14 "Music therapist" means a person who has (i) completed a bachelor's degree or higher in music 15 therapy, or its equivalent; (ii) satisfied the requirements for licensure set forth in regulations adopted by the Board pursuant to § 54.1-3709.2; and (iii) been issued a license for the independent practice of 16 17 music therapy by the Board.

18 "Music therapy" means the clinical and evidence-based use of music interventions to accomplish 19 individualized goals within a therapeutic relationship through an individualized music therapy treatment plan for the client that identifies the goals, objectives, and potential strategies of the music therapy 20 21 services appropriate for the client using music therapy interventions, which may include music 22 improvisation, receptive music listening, songwriting, lyric discussion, music and imagery, music performance, learning through music, and movement to music. "Music therapy" does not include the 23 24 screening, diagnosis, or assessment of any physical, mental, or communication disorder. 25

§ 54.1-3709.2. Music therapy; licensure.

26 A. The Board shall adopt regulations governing the practice of music therapy, upon consultation 27 with the Advisory Board on Music Therapy established in § 54.1-3709.3. The regulations shall (i) set 28 forth the educational, clinical training, and examination requirements for licensure to practice music 29 therapy; (ii) provide for appropriate application and renewal fees; and (iii) include requirements for 30 licensure renewal and continuing education. In developing such regulations, the Board shall consider requirements for board certification offered by the Certification Board for Music Therapists or any 31 32 successor organization.

33 B. No person shall engage in the practice of music therapy or hold himself out or otherwise 34 represent himself as a music therapist unless he is licensed by the Board.

35 C. Nothing in this section shall prohibit (i) the practice of music therapy by a student pursuing a course of study in music therapy if such practice constitutes part of the student's course of study and is 36 37 adequately supervised or (ii) a licensed health care provider, other professional registered, certified, or 38 licensed in the Commonwealth, or any person whose training and national certification attests to his 39 preparation and ability to practice his certified profession or occupation from engaging in the full scope 40 of his practice, including the use of music incidental to his practice, provided that he does not represent 41 himself as a music therapist. 42

#### § 54.1-3709.3. Advisory Board on Music Therapy; membership; terms.

43 A. The Advisory Board on Music Therapy (Advisory Board) is hereby established to assist the Board in formulating regulations related to the practice of music therapy. The Advisory Board shall also assist 44 45 in such other matters relating to the practice of music therapy as the Board may require.

B. The Advisory Board shall have a total membership of five nonlegislative citizen members to be 46 appointed by the Governor as follows: three members shall be licensed music therapists, one member 47 **48** shall be a licensed health care provider other than a music therapist, and one member shall be a citizen 49 at large.

50 C. After the initial staggering of terms, members shall be appointed for a term of four years. 51 Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. All 52 members may be reappointed. However, no member shall serve more than two consecutive four-year 53 terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not constitute 54 a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment. Vacancies shall be filled in the same 55 manner as the original appointments.

56 2. That the initial appointments of nonlegislative citizen members of the Advisory Board on Music 2 of 2

Therapy, created by this act, to be appointed by the Governor shall be staggered as follows: one 57 58 member, who shall be a music therapist who holds a certification issued by the Certification Board 59 for Music Therapists, shall be appointed for a term of one year; one member, who shall be a 60 music therapist who holds a certification issued by the Certification Board for Music Therapists, 61 shall be appointed for a term of two years; one member, who shall be a licensed health care provider other than a music therapist, shall be appointed for a term of three years; and two 62 members, one of whom shall be a music therapist who holds a certification issued by the 63 Certification Board for Music Therapists and one of whom shall be a citizen at large representing 64 65 the Commonwealth, shall be appointed for a term of four years.
