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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 56-596.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 56-596.2. Energy efficiency programs.
13	Each Phase I Utility and Phase II Utility, as such terms are defined in subdivision A 1 of § 56-585.1,
14	shall develop a proposed program of energy conservation measures. Any program shall provide for the
15	submission of a petition or petitions for approval to design, implement, and operate energy efficiency
16	programs pursuant to subdivision A 5 c of § 56-585.1. At least five percent of such energy efficiency
17	programs shall benefit low-income, elderly, and disabled individuals. The projected costs for the utility
18	to design, implement, and operate such energy efficiency programs and portfolios of programs, including
19	a margin to be recovered on operating expenses, shall be no less than an aggregate amount of \$140
20	million for a Phase I Utility and \$870 million for a Phase II Utility for the period beginning July 1,
21	2018, and ending July 1, 2028, including any existing approved energy efficiency programs. In
22	developing such portfolio of energy efficiency programs and portfolios of programs, each utility shall
23	utilize a stakeholder process, to be facilitated by an independent monitor compensated under the funding
24	provided pursuant to subdivision E of § 56-592.1, to provide input and feedback on (i) the development
25	of such energy efficiency programs and portfolios of programs; (ii) compliance with any required
26	incremental annual energy efficiency savings; (iii) recommended policy reforms by which the General
27	Assembly or Commission can ensure maximum and cost-effective deployment of energy efficiency
28	technology across the Commonwealth; and (iv) best practices for evaluation, measurement, and
29	verification for the purposes of assessing compliance with any required incremental annual energy
30	efficiency savings. Such stakeholder process shall include the participation of representatives from each
31	utility, the State Corporation Director of the Division of Public Utility Regulation within the
32	Commission and the relevant deputies and staff members of the Division who participate in approval
33	and oversight of utility energy efficiency programs, the office of Consumer Counsel of the Attorney
34	General, the Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy, energy efficiency program implementers,
35	energy efficiency providers, residential and small business customers, and any other interested
36	stakeholder who whom the independent monitor deems appropriate for inclusion in such process. The
37	independent monitor shall convene meetings of the participants in the stakeholder process not less
38	frequently than twice in each calendar year during the period beginning July 1, 2019, and ending July 1,
39	2028. The independent monitor shall report on the status of the energy efficiency stakeholder process,
40	including (i) (a) the objectives established by the stakeholder group during this process related to
41	programs to be proposed, (ii) (b) recommendations related to programs to be proposed that result from
42	the stakeholder process, and $(iii)$ (c) the status of those recommendations, in addition to the petitions
43	filed and the determination thereon, to the Governor, the State Corporation Commission, and the
44	Chairmen of the House and Senate Commerce and Labor Committees on July 1, 2019, and annually
45	thereafter through July 1, 2028.
