## Approved

### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. § 1. That the Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission shall engage an independent and 9 reputable national research organization with expertise in workers' compensation policy to conduct an 10 analysis to (i) develop options for covering workers' injuries caused by repetitive motion through the Virginia workers' compensation system and (ii) summarize key policy considerations associated with 11 modifying the Code of Virginia to cover injuries caused by repetitive motion. The analysis shall take 12 into consideration (a) the annual number of injuries caused by repetitive motion to workers in Virginia 13 and other states; (b) other states' evidentiary requirements for claiming workers' compensation benefits 14 for such injuries; (c) necessary changes to Virginia's statutory provisions; and (d) impacts on workers, 15 employers, and insurers. The Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission shall ensure that the 16 17 proposed options and policy considerations be submitted to the Chairmen of the House Committee on 18 Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance and Appropriations by November 30, 2020.
