20104843D HOUSE BILL NO. 658 1 Offered January 8, 2020 2 3 Prefiled January 6, 2020 4 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 2.2 a chapter numbered 3.3, consisting of 5 sections numbered 2.2-323 through 2.2-330, relating to establishing an independent commission to 6 investigate the May 31, 2019, Virginia Beach mass shooting; report. 7 Patrons-Convirs-Fowler, Miyares, Cole, J.G., Davis, Hope, Hurst, Kory, Rasoul and Samirah 8 9 Referred to Committee on Rules 10 Whereas, on the afternoon of May 31, 2019, 12 innocent individuals were brutally shot to death on 11 the grounds of Building 2 of the Virginia Beach Municipal Center; and 12 13 Whereas, during the same criminal act, four other innocent individuals were wounded by gunfire and 14 suffered physical and emotional injuries, many of the injuries of a severe and lasting nature; and 15 Whereas, employees of the City of Virginia Beach and local citizens have suffered immense 16 emotional trauma: and Whereas, all of the violence was at the hands of a city engineer who resigned from his position 17 18 earlier that day; and 19 Whereas, the government of the Commonwealth has a duty to investigate the mass shooting of May 20 31, 2019, in order to gain a fuller understanding of what happened that day so as to minimize the risk 21 of a tragedy of this nature from ever occurring again; and Whereas, May 31, 2019, will forever be remembered as a tragic day in the history of the 22 23 Commonwealth: now, therefore, 24 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 25 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 2.2 a chapter numbered 3.3, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-323 through 2.2-330, as follows: 26 27 CHAPTER 3.3. 28 COMMISSION TO INVESTIGATE THE MAY 31, 2019, VIRGINIA BEACH MASS SHOOTING. 29 § 2.2-323. Commission to Investigate the May 31, 2019, Virginia Beach Mass Shooting; purpose. 30 The Commission to Investigate the May 31, 2019, Virginia Beach Mass Shooting is established as an independent commission. The purpose of the Commission is to conduct an independent, thorough, objective incident review of the May 31, 2019, tragedy and make recommendations regarding improvements that can be made in the Commonwealth's laws, policies, procedures, systems, and 31 32 33 34 institutions, as well as those of other governmental agencies and private providers. 35 § 2.2-324. Membership; terms; vacancies; chairman and vice-chairman. 36 The Commission shall consist of 21 members appointed as follows: five nonlegislative citizen 37 members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; five nonlegislative citizen members to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; and 10 nonlegislative citizen members to be 38 39 appointed by the Governor. The Superintendent of State Police shall serve ex officio as a nonvoting 40 member of the Commission. Each nonlegislative citizen member of the Commission shall have significant 41 experience as a (i) law-enforcement officer, (ii) jurist, (iii) local government administrator, (iv) qualified, licensed forensic psychologist, (v) first responder, (vi) security expert, or (vii) IT specialist, and no 42 nonlegislative citizen member of the Commission shall be currently serving in an elected capacity. The 43 Governor shall appoint at least one person from each of the occupations and professions described in 44 clauses (i) through (vii). Every effort shall be made to ensure that appointees do not have a conflict of 45 46 interest vet can provide the best insight into their specialization. Unless otherwise approved in writing by the chairman of the Commission, Commission members 47 shall only be reimbursed for travel originating and ending within the Commonwealth for the purpose of 48 49 attending meetings. 50 The Superintendent of State Police shall serve a term coincident with his term of office. All other 51 Commission members shall be appointed for a term of two years. Appointments to fill vacancies, other 52 than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. All Commission members may be 53 reappointed. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. 54 The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership. § 2.2-325. Quorum; meetings. 55 A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The meetings of the Commission shall be held 56 57 at the call of the chairman or whenever the majority of the members so request. 58 § 2.2-326. Expenses.

59 Nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary 60 expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825.

§ 2.2-327. Powers and duties of the Commission. 61

62 The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

63 1. Investigate the underlying motive for the May 31, 2019, Virginia Beach mass shooting;

64 2. Investigate the gunman's personal background and entire prior employment history with the City of Virginia Beach and his interactions with coworkers and supervisors, including but not limited to 65 66 formal documentation and informal incidents;

3. Determine how the gunman was able to carry out his actions; 67

68 4. Identify any obstacles confronted by first responders;

69 5. Identify and examine the security procedures and protocols in place immediately prior to the mass 70 shooting:

71 6. Examine the post-shooting communications between law enforcement and the families of the 72 victims:

73 7. Study such other matters as it deems necessary to gain a comprehensive understanding of the 74 tragic events of May 31, 2019;

75 8. To the extent required by law, (i) protect the confidentiality of any individual's or family member's 76 personal or health information and (ii) make public or publish information and findings only in 77 summary or aggregate form without identifying personal or health information related to any individual 78 or family member unless authorization is obtained from an individual or family member that specifically 79 permits the Commission to disclose that person's personal or health information;

80 9. Ensure that its investigation does not impede any investigation into the matter being conducted by 81 law enforcement; and

82 10. Develop recommendations regarding improvements that can be made in the Commonwealth's 83 laws, policies, procedures, systems, and institutions, as well as those of other government agencies and 84 private providers, to minimize the risk of a tragedy of this nature from ever occurring again in the Commonwealth. 85

86 All local law-enforcement agencies and every locality shall provide assistance to the Commission, 87 upon request.

§ 2.2-328. Staffing.

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89 The Office of the State Inspector General or such other person or state entity under the Secretary of 90 Public Safety and Homeland Security as designated by the Governor shall provide staff support to the 91 Commission.

92 All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Office of the State Inspector 93 General or such other person or state entity as the Governor designates to staff the Commission, upon 94 request.

95 § 2.2-329. Chairman's executive summary of activity and work of the Commission.

Beginning in 2020, the chairman shall submit to the General Assembly and the Governor an annual 96 97 executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Commission no later than November 1 of 98 each year. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of 99 Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be 100 posted on the General Assembly's website. 101

§ 2.2-330. Sunset.

This chapter shall expire on November 1, 2022.

103 2. That the expenses of the Commission to Investigate the May 31, 2019, Virginia Beach Mass Shooting (the Commission), as created by this act, and the investigation conducted by the 104 Commission pursuant to this act shall be paid from existing appropriations to the Office of the 105 State Inspector General or any agency under the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland 106

107 Security, as determined by the Governor.
