	private sectors, often facing challenges, constraints, and disparities in legal rights that do not affect male
11	citizens of the United States; and WIJEREAS the women of the United States have worked to ensure that these rights and privileges.
12	WHEREAS, the women of the United States have worked to ensure that these rights and privileges
13	are available to all citizens equally, regardless of sex; and
14	WHEREAS, 12 of the Commonwealth's most prominent women leaders—Anne Burras Laydon,
15	Cockacoeske, Mary Draper Ingles, Martha Washington, Clementina Rind, Elizabeth Keckly, Sally L.
16	Tompkins, Maggie L. Walker, Sarah G. Jones, Laura S. Copenhaver, Virginia E. Randolph, and Adèle
17	Clark-were honored in 2019 with the dedication of the Virginia Women's Monument on Capitol

19	WHEREAS, over the course of Virginia's 400-year history, from the colonial period and the
20	foundation of the United States to the modern era, countless other women throughout the
21	Commonwealth have played a vital role in shaping the future of the nation and made significant
22	contributions as leaders in their communities, careers, and families; and
23	WHEREAS, in 1973, the United States Congress designated August 26, the anniversary date of the
24	passage of the Nineteenth Amendment, which prohibited states and the federal government from denying
25	citizens the right to vote on the basis of sex, as Women's Equality Day; and
26	WHEREAS, Women's Equality Day provides an opportunity to recognize the achievements of
27	Virginia women and raise awareness of the ongoing fight for equal rights for women in all aspects of
28	American life; now, therefore, be it
29	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate
30	August 26, in 2020 and in each succeeding year, as Women's Equality Day in Virginia; and, be it
31	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates transmit a copy of this resolution
32	to the Virginia chapter of the National Organization for Women so that members of the organization
