5 WHEREAS, Earsaline Anderson, a resident of Fauquier County, has worked to preserve the important history of local Rosenwald Schools, which were established across the South in the early 20th century to provide educational opportunities for African American children; and

9 WHEREAS, a retired federal government worker, Earsaline Anderson has spent time as a volunteer
10 monitoring deliberations related to the planned renovation and expansion of a middle school in Fauquier
11 County on behalf of the Afro-American Historical Association of Fauquier; and

WHEREAS, as a proponent of education as well as a teacher's secretary for Fauquier County Public
 Schools, Earsaline Anderson advocates for the commemoration of historical academic buildings in
 Fauquier, noting the importance of preserving and promoting African American history; and

15 WHEREAS, Earsaline Anderson has dedicated her life to serving others throughout the 16 Commonwealth and the United States and plans to continue to give back to her community and to her 17 spiritual home, Mount Olive Baptist Church, where she served as clerk; and

18 WHEREAS, Earsaline Anderson's work has uplifted the Fauquier community and helped to spread19 awareness of African American history and heritage in Virginia; now, therefore, be it

20 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
 21 commend Earsaline Anderson for her work to preserve the legacy of the all-black Rosenwald Schools in
 22 Fauquier County; and, be it

23 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution
 24 for presentation to Earsaline Anderson as an expression of the General Assembly's admiration for her

25 contributions to the community.
