7 Conference champion as an undergraduate at The Citadel, will be inducted into the Georgia Chapter of
8 the National Wrestling Hall of Fame; and

10 over the years; he served in the United States Army and Army Reserves for over 21 years, coached
11 wrestling at The Citadel for 15 years and elsewhere, and has owned multiple companies, such as Eagle

WHEREAS, Fitz Johnson has earned multiple degrees, earning a bachelor's degree in education from
The Citadel in 1985, a master's degree in education leadership and administration from Troy University
in 1991, and a law degree from the University of Kentucky College of Law in 1998; and

WHEREAS, Fitz Johnson serves as a member of the WellStar Health System Board of Trustees, the
Hospital Authority of Cobb County, Georgia, and the Town Center Community Improvement District;
he attributes his success to the discipline and life balance he learned as a wrestler; and

WHEREAS, Fitz Johnson is the only inductee to be named as an Outstanding American by the
Georgia Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2020, which recognizes former wrestlers
who have used the disciplines learned through wrestling to become highly successful in their
professional careers; now, therefore, be it
