9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. § 1. That the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) shall identify the owner or operator of any
11	combined sewer overflow (CSO) outfall east of Charlottesville that discharges into the James River
12 13	watershed. § 2. For any such owner or operator, DEQ shall, by July 1, 2021, determine what actions by the
13	owner or operator are necessary to bring the CSO outfall into compliance with Virginia law, the federal
15	Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.), and the Presumption Approach described in the CSO
16	Control Policy adopted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 59 F.R. 18688, unless a
17	higher level of control is necessary to comply with a total maximum daily load (TMDL), and shall
18	inform the owner or operator of the actions necessary.
19	[§ 3. Any such owner of a CSO outfall shall, by July 1, 2025, initiate construction activities
20 21	necessary to bring the CSO outfall into compliance and shall, by July 1, 2027, bring the CSO outfall into compliance with Virginia law, the federal Clean Water Act, and the Presumption Approach
22	described in the EPA CSO Control Policy, unless a higher level of control is necessary to comply with a
23	TMDL
24	§ 4. Any such owner of a CSO outfall shall report annually to DEQ on its progress pursuant to § 3.
25	No later than January 1 of each year, DEQ shall transmit, with any additional information the Director
26	of DEQ determines to be appropriate, the CSO outfall progress reports to the Chairmen of the Senate
27	Committee on Finance and Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and
28	Natural Resources, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the House Committee on Agriculture,
29 20	Chesapeake and Natural Resources, the Virginia delegation to the Chesapeake Bay Commission, the
30	Secretary of Natural Resources, and the Governor.]
