That § 51.5-154 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 51.5-154. (Expires July 1, 2020) Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Commission; 12 13 report. 14 A. The Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Commission (the Commission) is established as 15 an advisory commission in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the entity is to 16 assist people with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders and their caregivers. B. The Commission shall consist of 15 nonlegislative citizen members. Members shall be appointed 17 as follows: three members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; two members to 18 be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; and 10 members to be appointed by the Governor, of 19 20 whom seven shall be from among the boards, staffs, and volunteers of the Virginia chapters of the 21 Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Association and three shall be from the public at large. 22 Nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for a term of four years. Appointments to fill 23 vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. All members may be 24 reappointed. However, no nonlegislative citizen member shall serve more than two consecutive four-year 25 terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not constitute 26 a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment. Vacancies shall be filled in the same 27 manner as the original appointments. 28 The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership. A majority 29 of the voting members shall constitute a quorum. The Commission shall meet at least four times each 30 year. The meetings of the Commission shall be held at the call of the chairman or whenever the 31 majority of the voting members so request. C. Members shall receive such compensation for the discharge of their duties as provided in 32 33 § 2.2-2813. All members shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of 34 35 compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Department. 36 D. The Commission shall have the power and duty to: 37 1. Examine the needs of persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, as well as the needs 38 of their caregivers, and ways that state government can most effectively and efficiently assist in meeting 39 those needs: 40 2. Develop and promote strategies to encourage brain health and reduce cognitive decline; 41 3. Advise the Governor and General Assembly on policy, funding, regulatory, and other issues 42 related to persons suffering from Alzheimer's disease and related disorders and their caregivers; 4. Develop the Commonwealth's plan for meeting the needs of patients with Alzheimer's disease and 43 44 related disorders and their caregivers, and advocate for such plan; 5. Submit to the Governor, General Assembly, and Department by October 1 of each year an 45 electronic report regarding the activities and recommendations of the Commission, which shall be 46 submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the Division of 47 Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be 48 49 posted on the General Assembly's website and the Department's website; and 50 6. Establish priorities for programs among state agencies related to Alzheimer's disease and related 51 disorders and criteria to evaluate these programs. 52 E. The Department shall provide staff support to the Commission. All agencies of the 53 Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request. F. The Commission may apply for and expend such grants, gifts, or bequests from any source as 54 55 may become available in connection with its duties under this section and may comply with such conditions and requirements as may be imposed in connections therewith. 56
