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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-415 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 18.2-415. Disorderly conduct in public places.
13	A. A person is guilty of disorderly conduct if, with the intent to cause public inconvenience,
14 15	annoyance, or alarm, or recklessly creating a risk thereof, he: A. 1. In any street, highway, public building, <i>or public place</i> , or while in or on a public conveyance,
16	or public place engages in conduct having a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person or
17	persons at whom, individually, such conduct is directed; or
18	B. 2. Willfully or being intoxicated, whether willfully or not, and whether such intoxication results
19	from self-administered alcohol or other drug of whatever nature, disrupts any funeral, memorial service,
20	or meeting of the governing body of any political subdivision of this the Commonwealth or a division
21	or agency thereof, or of any school, literary society, or place of religious worship, if the disruption (i)
22 23	prevents or interferes with the orderly conduct of the funeral, memorial service, or meeting or (ii) has a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person or persons at whom, individually, the disruption
23 24	is directed; or
25	C. Willfully or while intoxicated, whether willfully or not, and whether such intoxication results from
26	self-administered alcohol or other drug of whatever nature, disrupts the operation of any school or any
27	activity conducted or sponsored by any school, if the disruption (i) prevents or interferes with the
28	orderly conduct of the operation or activity or (ii) has a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the
29 30	person or persons at whom, individually, the disruption is directed.
30 31	However, the conduct prohibited under subdivision A , $B I$ or C of this section 2 shall not be deemed to include the utterance or display of any words or to include conduct otherwise made punishable under
32	this title.
33	The person in charge of any such building, place, conveyance, meeting, operation, or activity may
34	eject therefrom any person who violates any provision of this section, with the aid, if necessary, of any
35	persons who may be called upon for such purpose.
36	B. The governing bodies of counties, cities, and towns are authorized to adopt ordinances prohibiting
37 38	and punishing the acts and conduct prohibited by this section, provided that the punishment fixed therefor shall not exceed that prescribed for a Class 1 misdemeanor.
39	<i>C.</i> A person violating any provision of this section shall be is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
