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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 1 of Title 9.1 an article numbered 14 consisting of a section numbered 0.1 101 as follows:

15 16	Virginia Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner Coordination Program. § 9.1-191. Virginia sexual assault forensic examiner coordination program.
10	A. The Department shall establish a Virginia sexual assault forensic examiner coordination program.
18	The program shall be headed by a coordinator (the Coordinator). The Coordinator shall:
19	<i>I. Create and coordinate an annual statewide sexual assault forensic nurse examiner training</i>
20	program in partnership with the Attorney General, the Department of Health, the Virginia Hospital and
2 0 2 1	Healthcare Association, and the Secretary of Health and Human Services;
22	2. Coordinate the development and enhancement of sexual assault forensic examiner programs across
23	the Commonwealth;
24	3. Coordinate the development of hospital protocols and guidelines for treatment of survivors of
25	sexual assault in partnership with the Department of Health;
26	4. Coordinate and strengthen communications among sexual assault nurse examiner medical
27	directors, sexual assault response teams, and hospitals for existing and developing sexual assault nurse
28	examiner programs;
29	5. Provide technical assistance for existing and developing sexual assault forensic examiner
30 31	<i>programs;</i> 6. Establish best practices for billing and reimbursement for medical services provided to survivors
32	of sexual assault;
33	7. Create and maintain a statewide list, updated biannually, to include the following:
34	a. A list of available sexual assault forensic examiners, sexual assault nurse examiners, sexual
35	assault forensic nurse examiners, and pediatric sexual assault nurse examiners;
36	b. The location and hospital affiliation of each examiner; and
37	c. The duty hours for each examiner and affiliated facility for sexual assault exam services;
38	8. Coordinate, share, and disseminate the list created pursuant to subdivision 7 to the emergency
	operations communications system available to emergency medical services and law-enforcement
40	agencies as well as the internal emergency and hospital communications system;
41	9. Share and disseminate the list created pursuant to subdivision 7 with all other relevant agencies,
42 43	including: law-enforcement agencies, attorneys for the Commonwealth, victim-witness programs, sexual
43 44	assault service organizations, the Department of Juvenile Justice, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Education, and school divisions;
45	10. Create sexual assault nurse examiner recruitment materials for universities and colleges with
46	nursing programs in partnership with the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia; and
47	11. Support and coordinate community education and public outreach, when appropriate, relating to
48	sexual assault nurse examiner issues for the Commonwealth.
49	B. The Coordinator may request and shall receive from every department, division, board, bureau,
50	commission, authority, or other agency created by the Commonwealth, or to which the Commonwealth is
51	a party, or any political subdivision thereof, cooperation and assistance in the performance of its duties.
52 52	The Coordinator may also consult and exchange information with local government agencies and
53 54	interested stakeholders.
54 55	C. The Coordinator shall report annually on or before October 1 to the Governor and the General Assembly. The report shall include a summary of activities for the year and any recommendations to
55 56	address sexual assault exams within the Commonwealth, including budget needs to increase the
57	availability of sexual assault exams within the Commonwealth, including budget needs to increase the availability of sexual assault exam services across the Commonwealth. The Department shall ensure that
58	such report is available to the public.

59 2. That the Department, in cooperation with Virginia's existing sexual assault forensic examiner 60 programs, shall submit a report providing a feasibility plan for the establishment of centers of 61 excellence as a model to increase the availability of sexual assault exam services to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations and the Senate Committee on Finance by January 1, 62 2022, as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the 63 processing of legislative documents, and the report shall be posted on the General Assembly's 64 website. The Department shall publish the report on the Department's website no later than 10 65 66 days following its submission to the General Assembly.
