8 9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That § 46.2-1078.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
11 12	§ 46.2-1078.1. Use of handheld personal communications devices in certain motor vehicles; exceptions; penalty.
13	A. It is unlawful for any person to operate a moving motor vehicle on the highways in the
14	Commonwealth while using any handheld personal communications device to:
15 16	1. Manually enter multiple letters or text in the device as a means of communicating with another person; or
17	2. Read any email or text message transmitted to the device or stored within the device, provided
18 19	that this prohibition shall not apply to any name or number stored within the device nor to any caller identification information.
20	B. It is unlawful for any person while driving a moving motor vehicle in a highway work zone, in a
21	school crossing zone, or on the property of a school to hold in his hand a handheld personal
22 23	communications device. C. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:
24	1. The operator of any emergency vehicle while he is engaged in the performance of his official
25 26	duties; 2. An operator who is lawfully parked or stopped;
27 27	3. The use of factory-installed or aftermarket global positioning systems (GPS) or wireless
28	communications devices used to transmit or receive data as part of a digital dispatch system; or
29 30	4. Any person using a handheld personal communications device to report an emergency.D. A violation of subsection A is a traffic infraction punishable, for a first offense, by a fine of \$125
31	and, for a second or subsequent offense, by a fine of \$250. A violation of subsection B is punishable by
32 33	a mandatory fine of \$250. E. For the purposes of this section:
33 34	"Emergency vehicle" means:
35	1. Any law-enforcement vehicle operated by or under the direction of a federal, state, or local
36 37	law-enforcement officer; 2. Any regional detention center vehicle operated by or under the direction of a correctional officer
38	responding to an emergency call or operating in an emergency situation;
39 40	3. Any vehicle used to fight fire, including publicly owned state forest warden vehicles, when traveling in response to a fire alarm or emergency call;
41	4. Any emergency medical services vehicle designed or used for the principal purpose of emergency
42 43	medical services where human life is endangered; 5. Any Department of Emergency Management vehicle or Office of Emergency Medical Services
43 44	vehicle, when responding to an emergency call or operating in an emergency situation;
45	6. Any Department of Corrections vehicle designated by the Director of the Department of
46 47	Corrections, when (i) responding to an emergency call at a correctional facility, (ii) participating in a drug-related investigation, (iii) pursuing escapees from a correctional facility, or (iv) responding to a
48	request for assistance from a law-enforcement officer; and
49 50	7. Any vehicle authorized to be equipped with alternating, blinking, or flashing red or red and white secondary warning lights pursuant to § 46.2-1029.2.
51	"Highway work zone" means a construction or maintenance area that is located on or beside a
52 53	highway and is marked by appropriate warning signs with attached flashing lights or other traffic control
53 54	devices indicating that work is in progress. "School crossing zone" means the same as that term is defined in § 46.2-873.
55	F. Distracted driving shall be included as a part of the driver's license knowledge examination.
