10	WHEREAS, the Honor and Sacrifice Flag was designed by Chesapeake resident George Lutz to
11	honor firefighters, law-enforcement officers, emergency medical services personnel, and other public
12	safety personnel who have given their lives in the line of duty; and
13	WHEREAS, the blue field of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag symbolizes the law-enforcement
14	community; and
15	WHEREAS, the purple field of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag signifies mourning for a loss in the
16	firefighter community; and
17	WHEREAS, the white field of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag recognizes the purity of heart within
18	each individual who serves and protects the community and is willing to face each day's challenges
19	regardless of the risk; and
20	WHEREAS, the black star of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag represents those who wear the distinctive
21	badge, including sheriffs and marshals; and
22	WHEREAS, the red Maltese cross of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag recognizes all who have fallen in
23	the emergency response communities; and
24	WHEREAS, the golden shield of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag recognizes all law-enforcement
25	officers and other public safety representatives who wear the shield, including emergency medical
26	services personnel, and who have made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty; gold represents the
27	value of the life given; and
28	WHEREAS, the folded flag element of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag signifies the final tribute to an
29 20	individual life that a family has lost for the sake of others; and
30 21	WHEREAS, the flame element of the Honor and Sacrifice Flag is an eternal reminder of the spirit
31 32	that has departed this life yet burns on in the memory of all who knew and loved the fallen hero; and
32 33	WHEREAS, the General Assembly of Virginia calls for a unifying symbol recognizing this nation's
33 34	solemn debt to fallen public safety workers and the families and communities who mourn their loss; now, therefore, be it
35	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Honor and Sacrifice Flag be
33 36	designated as the Commonwealth's emblem for honoring the brave men and women who have given
37	their lives for public safety; and, be it
38	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit a copy of this resolution to the
39	Director of the Department of Criminal Justice Services, the Executive Director of the Department of
40	Fire Programs, and the State Health Commissioner, requesting that they further disseminate copies of
41	this resolution to their respective constituents so that they may be apprised of the sense of the General
42	Assembly of Virginia in this matter; and, be it
43	RESOLVED FINALLY, That in the absence of a directive from the Governor or the Director of the
44	Department of General Services, the head of the state agency that controls any facility or building
45	outside of Capitol Square may determine when to display the Honor and Sacrifice Flag, provided that
46	the Honor and Sacrifice Flag that is displayed is (i) smaller in height and width than the flag of the
47	United States that is officially displayed at the building or facility and (ii) made in the United States.
