- **5. Summary:** Provides that any health care provider who has provided services within the last two years to a person committed to a local or regional correctional facility shall, in accordance with requirements for disclosures to a correctional institution or a law enforcement official authorized by the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, disclose to the local or regional correctional facility where the person is committed any information and records necessary to ensure continuity of care of the person committed.

The impact to the State Compensation Board cannot be determined at this time.
