4. Title: Commissioner of Health and the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality.

5. Summary: Directs the Commissioner of Health and the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality to convene a workgroup to develop a program to remediate septic systems in recurrently flooded areas of Resource Protection Areas by allowing owners of septic systems located in portions of Resource Protection Areas that are subject to recurrent flooding to add soil over the septic system tank and to the septic system drainfield to improve septic system drainfield absorption and protect the public health and safety.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth, the Department of Health, or the Department of Environmental Quality to convene a workgroup to develop a program to remediate septic systems.
