3. Committee: General Laws

4. Title: Virginia Human Rights Act; discrimination on the basis of sex; sexual harassment.

5. Summary: Creates a cause of action against any employer employing more than five but fewer than 15 persons who engages in an unlawful discriminatory act against any employee on the basis of sex. Under current law, an employee who has been discriminated against on the basis of sex may only file an action against his employer if the employee is discharged by the employer on the basis of sex. The bill permits a court, in cases where the employee prevails, to award compensatory or punitive damages and attorney fees not to exceed 25 percent of the amount awarded. The bill also clarifies that for purposes of the cause of action, discrimination on the basis of sex includes harassment on the basis of sex. The bill defines the types of conduct that amount to harassment on the basis of sex. The bill contains technical amendments.
