4. Title: Inquiry and report of immigration status; persons charged with or convicted of certain crimes.

5. Summary: This bill repeals sections of the Code of Virginia that require jail officers, officers in charge of correctional facilities, and probation and parole officers to ascertain the citizenship of anyone committed to a state or local correctional facility or anyone convicted of a felony in circuit court. This bill also removes the requirement of that intake officers report to the Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement any juvenile who has been detained on an allegation of committing a violent felony when the intake officer has probable cause to believe is in the United States illegally.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill removes current inquiry and reporting requirements regarding the citizenship status of certain offenders that are imposed on law enforcement, corrections, and juvenile justice officials. This bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on state agencies.
