4. Title: Department of Motor Vehicles; information for veterans

5. Summary: This bill requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to offer information on veteran services available in the Commonwealth to any person who identifies himself as a veteran on a document submitted to the Department. The provisions of this act shall become effective on January 1, 2021.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item #8.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill requires the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to offer information on veterans' services that are available in the Commonwealth to any person indicating on any form or application submitted to DMV that he is a veteran. The required information can be provided electronically, but printed materials must be available upon request. The bill charges the Department of Veterans Services (DVS) with the responsibility of furnishing DMV with all materials required to be offered. DMV is not required to verify a person's veteran status.

Programming changes to DMV's information systems will be needed for implementation and will cost \$13,101 and require 220 hours. The staff hours required to implement the bill can be accomplished during the normal work schedules for DMV employees, given current workloads. DMV would be able to absorb this cost within its existing resources.

11. Other Comments: The provisions of this act shall become effective on January 1, 2021.
