**4. Title:** Department of General Services; disposition of surplus materials; permit sale to military spouse.

**5. Summary:** Directs the Department of General Services to permit surplus materials to be sold, prior to public sale or auction, to military spouse-owned businesses. The bill requires the Director of the Department of Small Business and Supplier Diversity to adopt reasonable regulations to implement a program to certify, upon request of the business owner, that he holds a "Military spouse-owned business" status.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** No state fiscal impact.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The provisions directing the Department of General Services (DGS) to permit the sale of surplus materials, prior to public sale or auction, to military spouse-owned businesses does not generate a fiscal impact.
