4. Title: Unlawful hunting, fishing, or trapping; prohibition upon conviction.

5. Summary: This bill provides that any person convicted of violating a hunting, fishing, or trapping law may also be prohibited by the court from hunting, fishing, or trapping for a period of one to five years.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Game and Inland Fisheries anticipates a nominal loss of revenue as a result of this legislation. Based on FY 2019 offenses and the assumption that one quarter of offenders would have received a one year ban, the revenue loss for DGIF and the Game Protection Fund would be less than \$12,000 annually.
