4. Title: State-owned structures; DGS to determine which structures are high-risk.

5. Summary: Directs the Department of General Services to (i) determine which state-owned structures have a higher likelihood of being involved in a natural or man-made emergency that may require special access by law-enforcement personnel and (ii) study the desirability and feasibility of coordinating with local law enforcement in the installation of certain key boxes permitting law-enforcement officials to gain access to such structure during an emergency. The bill permits the department to implement procedures for installing such key boxes to the extent that the department determines such action is desirable and feasible. The department is to report its findings to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2020.
