**4. Title:** Emergency Medical Services Patient Care Information System; trauma data; confidentiality.

**5. Summary:** Authorizes the State Health Commissioner to disclose certain confidential data in the Emergency Medical Services Patient Care Information System, including information, research, or medical data that identifies patients by name or address, with entities that seek to improve the delivery of prehospital and hospital emergency medical services, the quality of patient care, and access to medical services or to make other system improvements. That the Board of Health shall develop and approve a policy specific to the sharing of data from the Emergency Medical Services Patient Care Information System.
