4. Title: Jewelry store license

5. Summary: The proposed bill creates a jewelry store license, which (i) may be granted to a permanent retail establishment in which at least 75 percent of its annual sales come from the sale of jewelry and (ii) authorizes the licensee to serve two five-ounce glasses of wine or two 12-ounce glasses of beer to any bona fide customer. The bill establishes state and local license fees for such license.

The bill contains an enactment clause.

8. Fiscal Implications: The proposed bill creates a new license type for jewelry store licensees and establishes the license fee at \$100.

According to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority ("ABC"), it is unknown as to how many jewelry store establishments exist in the Commonwealth that meet requirements of the proposed bill. The bill will require ABC to process applications, conduct licensing inspections and address compliance-related complaints. However, the overall impact on ABC Enforcement Division resources cannot be determined nor can the amount of revenue that would be generated by this new license fee.
