**3. Committee:** Education

**4. Title:** Board of Education; uniform minimum standards modern; public school buildings.

**5. Summary:** Requires the Board of Education to prescribe by regulation uniform minimum standards for the erection of modern public school buildings and the modernization of existing public school buildings for the purpose of promoting positive educational outcomes for each public elementary and secondary school student. The bill requires such regulations to include uniform minimum modern public school building standards that promote (i) the delivery of instruction that complies with the Standards of Learning by addressing enrollment capacity and available space and (ii) the health and safety of each enrolled student. The bill requires each school board to, once every three years, (a) assess and report to the Board the extent to which each public school building in the local school division complies with such uniform minimum standards and (b) submit to the Board a long-range plan for compliance with such uniform minimum standards, including an assessment of the cost of such compliance, in any case in which the school board determines that a public school building in the local school division does not comply with such standards. These requirements will not become effective unless an appropriation effectuating these purposes is included in a general appropriation act passed in 2020 by the General assembly that becomes law.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The Department of Education (DOE) anticipates the need to hire additional wage support to administer the requirements of this bill during reporting years, with an estimated cost of \$40,000 for salary and \$10,000 for technology and travel expenses. DOE can absorb any cost to develop the regulations required by this bill. Any fiscal impact to local school divisions is indeterminate.
