## **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 5011**

Offered August 24, 2020

Designating August, in 2020 and in each succeeding year, as Women's Suffrage Month in Virginia.

WHEREAS, an organized movement to enfranchise women first gained prominence in July 1848 at a convention in Seneca Falls, New York; and

WHEREAS, at the height of this movement, dedicated and courageous women, referred to as suffragists, sacrificed their personal lives and their financial resources over the course of more than 70 years to gain equal rights for women, especially the right to vote; and

WHEREAS, women and men of all races and creeds supported the movement for women to gain the constitutional right to have an equal voice in making the laws that govern them; and

WHEREAS, the women's suffrage movement led to the passage of the Nineteenth Amendment to the
 Constitution of the United States in 1919, with ratification by the last state necessary on August 18,
 1920; and

18 WHEREAS, the Nineteenth Amendment is a milestone in the ongoing history of women's suffrage;19 in the century since its adoption, suffrage has been continually fought for and won against20 discriminatory policies that have denied many Americans the full rights of citizenship; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, women constitute a majority of voters in the nation, are running for office in higher numbers, and are more active in the election process than ever before in history; and

WHEREAS, the 100th anniversary of women gaining the right to vote in the United States offers an
opportunity to appreciate the impact these historic accomplishments have had on citizen engagement in
the electoral process and on civic life at local, state, and national levels and to recognize the value of
ongoing efforts to ensure that progress continues; now, therefore, be it
