10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 37.2-304 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
13	§ 37.2-304. Duties of Commissioner.
14	The Commissioner shall be the chief executive officer of the Department and shall have the
15	following duties and powers:
16 17	 To supervise and manage the Department and its state facilities. To employ the personnel required to carry out the purposes of this title.
17 18	3. To make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of
19	the Department's duties and the execution of its powers under this title, including contracts with the
20	United States, other states, and agencies and governmental subdivisions of the Commonwealth,
21	consistent with policies and regulations of the Board and applicable federal and state statutes and
22	regulations.
23 24	4. To accept, hold, and enjoy gifts, donations, and bequests on behalf of the Department from the United States government, agencies and instrumentalities thereof, and any other source, subject to the
25	approval of the Governor. To these ends, the Commissioner shall have the power to comply with
26	conditions and execute agreements that may be necessary, convenient, or desirable, consistent with
27	policies and regulations of the Board.
28	5. To accept, execute, and administer any trust in which the Department may have an interest, under
29 30	the terms of the instruments creating the trust, subject to the approval of the Governor. 6. To transfer between state hospitals and training centers school-age individuals who have been
31	identified as appropriate to be placed in public school programs and to negotiate with other school
32	divisions for placements in order to ameliorate the impact on those school divisions located in a
33	jurisdiction in which a state hospital or training center is located.
34	7. To provide to the Director of the Commonwealth's designated protection and advocacy system,
35 36	established pursuant to § 51.5-39.13, a written report setting forth the known facts of (i) critical incidents, as that term is defined in § 37.2-709.1, or deaths of individuals receiving services in facilities
30 37	and (ii) serious injuries incidents, as that term is defined in regulations adopted by the Board pursuant to
38	Chapter 4 (§ 37.2-400 et seq.), or and deaths and alleged abuse, neglect, or exploitation of individuals
39	receiving services in programs operated or licensed by the Department within 15 working days of the
40	critical incident, serious injury, or death event about which a report is required pursuant to this
41	subdivision.
42 43	8. To work with the appropriate state and federal entities to ensure that any individual who has received services in a state facility for more than one year has possession of or receives prior to
44	discharge any of the following documents, when they are needed to obtain the services contained in his
45	discharge plan: a Department of Motor Vehicles approved identification card that will expire 90 days
46	from issuance, a copy of his birth certificate if the individual was born in the Commonwealth, or a
47	social security card from the Social Security Administration. State facility directors, as part of their
48 49	responsibilities pursuant to § 37.2-837, shall implement this provision when discharging individuals. 9. To work with the Department of Veterans Services and the Department for Aging and
49 50	Rehabilitative Services to establish a program for mental health and rehabilitative services for Virginia
51	veterans and members of the Virginia National Guard and Virginia residents in the Armed Forces
52	Reserves not in active federal service and their family members pursuant to § 2.2-2001.1.
53	10. To establish and maintain a pharmaceutical and therapeutics committee composed of
54 55	representatives of the Department of Medical Assistance Services, state facilities operated by the
55 56	Department, community services boards, at least one health insurance plan, and at least one individual receiving services to develop a drug formulary for use at all community services boards, state facilities
57	operated by the Department, and providers licensed by the Department.
58	11. To establish and maintain the Commonwealth Mental Health First Aid Program pursuant to

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59 § 37.2-312.2.

60 12. To submit a report for the preceding fiscal year by December 1 of each year to the Governor and 61 the Chairmen of the House Committee on Appropriations and Senate Committee on Finance and Appropriations that provides information on the operation of Virginia's publicly funded behavioral health 62 63 and developmental services system. The report shall include a brief narrative and data on the number of 64 individuals receiving state facility services or community services board services, including purchased inpatient psychiatric services; the types and amounts of services received by these individuals; and state 65 facility and community services board service capacities, staffing, revenues, and expenditures. The 66 annual report shall describe major new initiatives implemented during the past year and shall provide 67 information on the accomplishment of systemic outcome and performance measures during the year. **68** 13. To establish a comprehensive program for the prevention and treatment of problem gambling in

70 the Commonwealth and administer the Problem Gambling Treatment and Support Fund established
71 pursuant to § 37.2-314.2.

72 Unless specifically authorized by the Governor to accept or undertake activities for compensation, the73 Commissioner shall devote his entire time to his duties.
