21103246D 1 **HOUSE BILL NO. 2120** 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Education 4 on February 1, 2021) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate Keam) 6 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 23.1-409, 23.1-802, and 23.1-1303 of the Code of Virginia, relating to 7 public institutions of higher education; governing boards; meetings, input, and disclosures. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 9 1. That §§ 23.1-409, 23.1-802, and 23.1-1303 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 10 follows: 11 § 23.1-409. Transparency in higher education information. 12 Each baccalaureate public institution of higher education shall maintain and update annually no later than September 30 a tab or link on the home page of its website that shall include the following 13 14 information: 15 1. The institution's six-year undergraduate graduation rate for each of the past 10 years; 16 2. The institution's freshman-to-sophomore retention rate for full-time undergraduate students for each 17 of the past 10 years; 18 3. The institution's average annual percentage increase in base undergraduate tuition for each of the 19 past 10 years; 20 4. The institution's average annual percentage increase in mandatory undergraduate comprehensive 21 student fees for each of the past 10 years; 22 5. A link to the annual report of the use of student fees as required by $\S 23.1-408$; 23 6. A link to the postsecondary education and employment data referenced in subsection D of 24 § 23.1-204.1; and 25 7. A summary of the institution's budget, consistent with the institution's annual budgeting process, 26 that includes (i) the major budget units (MBUs) in the institution and standard expenditure categories 27 within each MBU for the current fiscal year and the previous fiscal year or (ii) a link to the annual 28 reports required by subdivision B 10 11 of § 23.1-1303. 29 § 23.1-802. Student mental health; policies; website resource; training. 30 A. The governing board of each public institution of higher education shall develop and implement policies that (i) advise students, faculty, and staff, including residence hall staff, of the proper procedures 31 32 for identifying and addressing the needs of students exhibiting suicidal tendencies or behavior and (ii) provide for training where appropriate. Such policies shall require procedures for notifying the 33 institution's student health or counseling center for the purposes set forth in subdivision B 4 5 of 34 35 § 23.1-1303 when a student exhibits suicidal tendencies or behavior. 36 B. The board of visitors of each baccalaureate public institution of higher education shall develop 37 and implement policies that ensure that after a student suicide, affected students have access to 38 reasonable medical and behavioral health services, including postvention services. For the purposes of 39 this subsection, "postvention services" means services designed to facilitate the grieving or adjustment 40 process, stabilize the environment, reduce the risk of negative behaviors, and prevent suicide contagion. C. The board of visitors of each baccalaureate public institution of higher education shall establish a written memorandum of understanding with its local community services board or behavioral health authority and with local hospitals and other local mental health facilities in order to expand the scope of services available to students seeking treatment. The memorandum shall designate a contact person to be notified, to the extent allowable under state and federal privacy laws, when a student is involuntarily 45 committed, or when a student is discharged from a facility. The memorandum shall provide for the 46 inclusion of the institution in the post-discharge planning of a student who has been committed and 47 intends to return to campus, to the extent allowable under state and federal privacy laws. **48** 49 D. Each baccalaureate public institution of higher education shall create and feature on its website a 50 page with information dedicated solely to the mental health resources available to students at the 51 institution. E. Each resident assistant in a student housing facility at a public institution of higher education shall 52 53 participate in Mental Health First Aid training or a similar program prior to the commencement of his duties.

§ 23.1-1303. Governing boards; duties.

A. For purposes of this section, "intellectual property" means (i) a potentially patentable machine, 56 57 article of manufacture, composition of matter, process, or improvement in any of those; (ii) an issued patent; (iii) a legal right that inheres in a patent; or (iv) anything that is copyrightable. 58 59

B. The governing board of each public institution of higher education shall:

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60 1. Adopt and post conspicuously on its website bylaws for its own governance, including provisions that (i) establish the requirement of transparency, to the extent required by law, in all board actions; (ii) 61 describe the board's obligations under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (§ 2.2-3700 et seq.), as 62 63 set forth in subdivision B 10 of § 23.1-1301, including the requirements that (a) the board record 64 minutes of each open meeting and post the minutes on the board's website, in accordance with 65 subsection H of § 2.2-3707 and § 2.2-3707.1, (b) discussions and actions on any topic not specifically exempted by § 2.2-3711 be held in an open meeting, (c) the board give public notice of all meetings, in 66 accordance with subsection C of § 2.2-3707, and (d) any action taken in a closed meeting be approved 67 in an open meeting before it can have any force or effect, in accordance with subsection B of 68 § 2.2-3711; and (iii) require that the board invite the Attorney General's appointee or representative to 69 70 all meetings of the board, executive committee, and board committees;

2. Establish and maintain on the institution's website (i) a listing of all board members, including the name of the Governor who made each appointment and the date of each appointment; (ii) a listing of all committees created by the board and the membership of each committee; (iii) a schedule of all upcoming meetings of the full board and its committees and instructions for the public to access such meetings; (iv) an archive of agendas and supporting materials for each meeting of the governing board and its committees that were held; and (v) an email address or email addresses that allow board members to receive public communications pertaining to board business;

2. 3. Establish regulations or institution policies for the acceptance and assistance of students that
 include provisions (i) that specify that individuals who have knowingly and willfully failed to meet the
 federal requirement to register for the selective service are not eligible to receive any state direct student
 assistance, (ii) that specify that the accreditation status of a public high school in the Commonwealth
 shall not be considered in making admissions determinations for students who have earned a diploma
 pursuant to the requirements established by the Board of Education, and (iii) relating to the admission of
 certain graduates of comprehensive community colleges as set forth in § 23.1-907;

3. 4. Assist the Council in enforcing the provisions relating to eligibility for financial aid;

Notwithstanding any other provision of state law, establish policies and procedures requiring the 87 notification of the parent of a dependent student when such student receives mental health treatment at 88 the institution's student health or counseling center and such treatment becomes part of the student's 89 educational record in accordance with the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act 90 (42 U.S.C. § 1320d et seq.) and may be disclosed without prior consent as authorized by the federal 91 Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20 U.S.C. § 1232g) and related regulations (34 C.F.R. Part 92 99). Such notification shall only be required if it is determined that there exists a substantial likelihood 93 that, as a result of mental illness the student will, in the near future, (i) cause serious physical harm to 94 himself or others as evidenced by recent behavior or any other relevant information or (ii) suffer serious 95 harm due to his lack of capacity to protect himself from harm or to provide for his basic human needs. 96 However, notification may be withheld if any person licensed to diagnose and treat mental, emotional, or behavioral disorders by a health regulatory board within the Department of Health Professions who is 97 98 treating the student has made a part of the student's record a written statement that, in the exercise of 99 his professional judgment, the notification would be reasonably likely to cause substantial harm to the 100 student or another person. No public institution of higher education or employee of a public institution 101 of higher education making a disclosure pursuant to this subsection is civilly liable for any harm 102 resulting from such disclosure unless such disclosure constitutes gross negligence or willful misconduct 103 by the institution or its employees;

5. 6. Establish policies and procedures requiring the release of the educational record of a dependent student, as defined by the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20 U.S.C. § 1232g), to a parent at his request;

107 6. 7. Establish programs to seek to ensure that all graduates have the technology skills necessary to compete in the twenty-first century and that all students matriculating in teacher-training programs receive instruction in the effective use of educational technology;

110 7. 8. Establish policies for the discipline of students who participate in varsity intercollegiate
111 athletics, including a provision requiring an annual report by the administration of the institution to the
112 governing board regarding enforcement actions taken pursuant to such policies;

8. 9. In addition to all meetings prescribed in Chapters 14 (§ 23.1-1400 et seq.) through 29
(§ 23.1-2900 et seq.), meet with the chief executive officer of the institution at least once annually, in a
closed meeting pursuant to subdivision A 1 of § 2.2-3711 and deliver an evaluation of the chief
executive officer's performance. Any change to the chief executive officer's employment contract during
any such meeting or any other meeting of the board shall be made only by a vote of the majority of the
board's members;

9. 10. If human research, as defined in § 32.1-162.16, is conducted at the institution, adopt regulations pursuant to the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) to effectuate the provisions of Chapter 5.1 (§ 32.1-162.16 et seq.) of Title 32.1 for human research. Such regulations shall require

the human research committee to submit to the Governor, the General Assembly, and the chief executive
officer of the institution or his designee at least annually a report on the human research projects
reviewed and approved by the committee and require the committee to report any significant deviations
from approved proposals;

126 10. 11. Submit and make publicly available on the institution's website the annual financial
127 statements for the fiscal year ending the preceding June 30 and the accounts and status of any ongoing
128 capital projects to the Auditor of Public Accounts for the audit of such statements pursuant to § 30-133;

129 44. 12. No later than December 1 of each year, report to the Council and make publicly available on 130 the institution's website (i) the value of investments as reflected on the Statement of Net Position as of 131 June 30 of the previous fiscal year, excluding any funds derived from endowment donations, endowment 132 income, or other private philanthropy; (ii) the cash earnings on such balances in the previous fiscal year; 133 and (iii) the use of the cash earnings on such balances. In the event that the commitment of any such 134 investment earnings spans more than one fiscal year, the report shall reflect the commitments made in each future fiscal year. The reports of the Boards of Visitors of Virginia Commonwealth University and 135 136 the University of Virginia shall exclude the value of and earnings on any investments held by the Virginia Commonwealth University Health System Authority and the University of Virginia Medical Center, respectively. As used in this subdivision, "investments" includes all short-term, long-term, liquid, 137 138 139 and illiquid Statement of Net Position accounts, and subaccounts thereof, in which moneys have been 140 invested in securities.

141 12. 13. Submit to the General Assembly and the Governor and make publicly available on the
142 institution's website an annual executive summary of its interim activity and work no later than the first
143 day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as
144 provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of
145 legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website;

146 13. 14. Make available to any interested party upon request a copy of the portion of the most recent
147 report of the Uniform Crime Reporting Section of the Department of State Police entitled "Crime in
148 Virginia" pertaining to institutions of higher education;

149 14. 15. Adopt policies or institution regulations regarding the ownership, protection, assignment, and
150 use of intellectual property and provide a copy of such policies or institution regulations to the Governor
151 and the Joint Commission on Technology and Science. All employees, including student employees, of
152 public institutions of higher education are bound by the intellectual property policies or institution
153 regulations of the institution employing them; and

154 15. 16. Adopt policies that are supportive of the intellectual property rights of matriculated students
 155 who are not employed by such institution; and

156 17. Solicit the input of representatives of the institution's faculty senate or its equivalent (i) at least
157 twice per academic year on topics of general interest to the faculty and (ii) in advance of decisions to
158 be made on the search for the institution's new chief executive officer.

2. That the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, in consultation with the Virginia 159 160 Freedom of Information Advisory Council, shall work with the public institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth and with technology experts to develop a minimal uniform 161 162 standard, to the extent practicable, for providing the public with real-time electronic access to meetings of the governing boards of public institutions of higher education. Such minimal uniform 163 standard shall be implemented by each public institution of higher education no later than July 1, 164 165 2022, and any policy changes necessary to effectuate such implementation shall be recommended 166 to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on Education and Health no later than November 1, 2021. 167

168 3. That pursuant to the provisions of subdivision 15 of § 23.1-203 of the Code of Virginia, the 169 State Council of Higher Education for Virginia shall consider updates to § 23.1-1304 of the Code 170 of Virginia and to other provisions of law to address changes being made by public institutions of 171 higher education whose governing boards hold virtual meetings and the institutions' efforts to 172 improve public transparency through real-time electronic access to such meetings and shall report 173 any recommendations to the governing board of each public institution of higher education and to

174 the General Assembly no later than November 1, 2021.
