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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-323 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 22.1-323. Licenses generally.
13	A. No person shall open, operate, or conduct any school for students with disabilities in this the
14	Commonwealth without a license to operate such school issued by the Board of Education. A license
15	shall be issued for a school if it is in compliance with the regulations of the Board issued pursuant to
16	this chapter, any fee for such license has been paid, and its facilities are approved by the Board after an
17	inspection by the Department. No such license shall be transferable. The license shall be prominently
18	displayed on the premises of the school in a place open for inspection by any interested person during
19	the hours of operation.
20	B. Notwithstanding the provisions of § 22.1-19, the Board shall require, pursuant to regulation, any
21	private school for students with disabilities that is licensed by the Board, as a condition for renewal of
22	its initial license to operate, to obtain accreditation from an accrediting agency recognized by the
23	Virginia Council for Private Education within three years of the issuance of its initial triennial license
24	by the Board.
25	C. Any license issued to a residential school for students with disabilities, except a provisional or
26	conditional license issued pursuant to § 22.1-323.1, may, upon written notification to the school, expire
27	on a date subsequent to its stated expiration date and determined at the discretion of the Board, but in
28 29	no case later than three years from the effective date. Licenses issued to residential schools for students
29 30	with disabilities which are effective on or after July 1, 1992, may be issued for periods of up to three successive years. Licenses may be issued to private day special education schools for periods of up to
30 31	three successive years.
31 32	C. D. The Superintendent or his authorized agents may make unannounced inspections of each
32 33	school for students with disabilities each year.
33 34	2. That notwithstanding the provisions of the first enactment of this act, any private school for
35	students with disabilities that is licensed to operate by the Board of Education as of July 1, 2021,
36	shall obtain accreditation from an accrediting agency recognized by the Virginia Council for
37	Private Education no later than July 1, 2024.
