9 10	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth has fully participated in the observance of daylight saving time by
11	turning clocks forward one hour in the spring and back one hour in the fall since 1967, with the
12	implementation of the Uniform Time Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. § 260 et seq.); and
13	WHEREAS, the overwhelming conclusion of researchers is that the act of changing the clocks twice
14	per year directly results in an increase in heart attacks, traffic accidents, workplace injuries, pedestrian
15	deaths, crime, and sleep disruption as well as a loss of productivity; and
16 17	WHEREAS, research suggests an association between the biannual clock change and seasonal affective disorder, strokes, and cardiac arrest; and
18	WHEREAS, researchers have determined that remaining in daylight saving time year-round will save
1 9	significant amounts of energy in November and February and will lead to a decrease in childhood
20	obesity by increasing the amount of sunlight after school hours; and
21	WHEREAS, 13 states have enacted legislation to provide for a year-round daylight saving time if
22	allowed to do so by Congress; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Secretary of Commerce and
24 25	Trade be requested to study the effects of daylight saving time on the Commonwealth. In conducting his study, the Secretary of Commerce and Trade shall (i) review the effect of the
2 6	Commonwealth's continued participation under the Uniform Time Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. § 260 et seq.),
27	(ii) determine the potential consequences of a decision to use standard time year-round in the
28	Commonwealth, (iii) determine the potential consequences of a decision to use daylight saving time
29	year-round in the Commonwealth, and (iv) review other related issues and make recommendations as
30	appropriate.
31 32	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Secretary of Commerce and Trade
32 33	for this study, upon request. The Secretary of Commerce and Trade shall complete his meetings by November 30, 2021, and shall
33 34	submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of his findings
35	and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and
36	report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
37	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2022
38	Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
