That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 2 of Title 24.2 an article numbered 12 13 2.1, consisting of sections numbered 24.2-209.1 and 24.2-209.2, as follows: 14 Article 2.1. Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote. 15 § 24.2-209.1. Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote; form 16 17 of compact. The Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote is enacted into law 18 19 and entered into with all other jurisdictions legally joining therein in the form substantially as follows: 20 ARTICLE I. Membership. 21 Any state of the United States and the District of Columbia may become a member of this agreement 22 by enacting this agreement. 23 ARTICLE II. Right of the People in Member States to Vote for President and Vice President. 24 Each member state shall conduct a statewide popular election for President and Vice President of 25 the United States. 26 ARTICLE III. Manner of Appointing Presidential Electors in Member States. 27 Prior to the time set by law for the meeting and voting by the presidential electors, the chief election 28 official of each member state shall determine the number of votes for each presidential slate in each 29 state of the United States and in the District of Columbia in which votes have been cast in a statewide popular election and shall add such votes together to produce a "national popular vote total" for each 30 31 presidential slate. 32 The chief election official of each member state shall designate the presidential slate with the largest 33 national popular vote total as the "national popular vote winner." 34 The presidential elector certifying official of each member state shall certify the appointment in that 35 official's own state of the elector slate nominated in that state in association with the national popular 36 vote winner. 37 At least six days before the day fixed by law for the meeting and voting by the presidential electors, 38 each member state shall make a final determination of the number of popular votes cast in the state for 39 each presidential slate and shall communicate an official statement of such determination within 24 40 hours to the chief election official of each other member state. The chief election official of each member state shall treat as conclusive an official statement 41 containing the number of popular votes in a state for each presidential slate made by the day established by federal law for making a state's final determination conclusive as to the counting of 42 43 44 electoral votes by Congress. 45 In event of a tie for the national popular vote winner, the presidential elector certifying official of each member state shall certify the appointment of the elector slate nominated in association with the 46 47 presidential slate receiving the largest number of popular votes within that official's own state. **48** If, for any reason, the number of presidential electors nominated in a member state in association 49 with the national popular vote winner is less than or greater than that state's number of electoral votes. 50 the presidential candidate on the presidential slate that has been designated as the national popular 51 vote winner shall have the power to nominate the presidential electors for that state, and that state's presidential elector certifying official shall certify the appointment of such nominees. 52 53 The chief election official of each member state shall immediately release to the public all vote counts or statements of votes as they are determined or obtained. 54 55 This article shall govern the appointment of presidential electors in each member state in any year in which this agreement is, on July 20, in effect in states cumulatively possessing a majority of the 56

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57	electoral votes.
58	ARTICLE IV. Other Provisions.
59	This agreement shall take effect when states cumulatively possessing a majority of the electoral votes
60	have enacted this agreement in substantially the same form and the enactments by such states have
61	taken effect in each state.
62	Any member state may withdraw from this agreement, except that withdrawal occurring six months
6 <u>3</u>	or less before the end of a President's term shall not become effective until a President or Vice
64	President shall have been qualified to serve the next term.
65	The chief executive of each member state shall promptly notify the chief executive of all other states
05 66	of when this agreement has been enacted and has taken effect in that official's state, when the state has
67	
67 68	withdrawn from this agreement, and when this agreement takes effect generally.
00 69	This agreement shall terminate if the electoral college is abolished.
09 70	If any provision of this agreement is held invalid, the remaining provisions shall not be affected.
70 71	ARTICLE V. Definitions. For purposes of this agreement,
72	"Chief election official" shall mean the state official or body that is authorized to certify the total
73	number of popular votes for each presidential slate.
73 74	"Chief executive" shall mean the governor of a state of the United States or the mayor of the District
75	of Columbia.
76	"Elector slate" shall mean a slate of candidates who have been nominated in a state for the position
77	of presidential elector in association with a presidential slate.
78	"Presidential elector" shall mean an elector for President and Vice President of the United States.
79	"Presidential elector certifying official" shall mean the state official or body that is authorized to
80	certify the appointment of the state's presidential electors.
81	"Presidential slate" shall mean a slate of two persons, the first of whom has been nominated as a
82	candidate for President of the United States and the second of whom has been nominated as a
83	candidate for Vice President of the United States, or any legal successors to such persons, regardless of
84	whether both names appear on the ballot presented to the voter in a particular state.
85	"State" shall mean a state of the United States and the District of Columbia.
86	"Statewide popular election" shall mean a general election in which votes are cast for presidential
87	slates by individual voters and counted on a statewide basis.
88	§ 24.2-209.2. Appointment of presidential electors pursuant to Agreement.
89	When the Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote governs the
90	appointment of presidential electors for a presidential election as provided in the ninth clause of Article
91	III of that Agreement, as provided for in § 24.2-209.1, the provisions of that Agreement shall supersede

92 any conflicting provisions of the laws of the Commonwealth.
